Humber Diamond Jubilee Flotilla

A spectacular Flotilla with historic and modern vessels, including tugs, Ierne (the 1920 Olympics winning yacht), Sobriety, HMS Explorer, Humber Rescue, an underwater search team vessel and lots more; an RAF Sea King helicopter and Oscar99 (the Police helicopter) will fly over. The Flotilla will assemble in the late afternoon on the Humber near Makro and sail past Hessle and North Ferriby before turning across the River at Brough Haven, to return along the south bank to Hull.

After the Flotilla

Between the Flotilla sail-past and the beacon lighting, you are invited to bring a picnic and enjoy some evening entertainment. Or take advantage of the refreshments provided. These will include sandwiches, paninis, wraps, hot dogs, burgers, cakes, crisps and fish and chips.

If you decide to go home for a rest, please feel free to come back later for the Beacon lighting and firework display.

Beacon Lighting

At approx. 10.15 p.m., synchronised with beacons in Hessle, Hull and Barton-on-Humber and a bonfire on South Ferriby cliff. The Humber Bridge towers will be illuminated at the same time. The skies of Britain will turn red as more than 4,000 beacons are lit across the land to celebrate the Queen's six decades on the throne. At 10.30, in what is set to be a memorable moment, Her Majesty will trigger the lighting of the final beacon by placing a huge crystal into a specially designed pod at a concert given in her honour.

Firework Display

The beacon lighting will be followed by a Firework Display on the Riverside Walkway.

All proceeds from the Ferriby Diamond Jubilee Festival will go to the Village Hall and North Ferriby Riding for the Disabled Group.
